# WCH Tokyo 25 to celebrate 100 days to go with special weekend event in Tokyo



As we gear up to celebrate 100 days to go until the start of the World Athletics Championships Tokyo 25 (WCH Tokyo 25), on Thursday 5 June, Tokyo is stepping up the excitement with a two-day public celebration in the heart of the city.

On Saturday 7 and Sunday 8 June, the iconic Gyoko-dori Avenue, nestled between Tokyo Station and the Imperial Palace, will be transformed into a hub of athletic energy for a special 100 DAYS TO GO! event. The event will feature hands-on experiences where visitors of all ages can try their hands at the core disciplines of athletics—running, jumping, and throwing — in an open and inclusive environment.

Three of Japan's most celebrated athletes will be on hand to inspire the crowd:

- Olympic marathon gold medalist Mizuki Noguchi
- Japanese high jump record holder Naoto Tobe
- Former national champion hurdler Taiho Kanai

Each will showcase their skills through live demonstrations, offering fans a rare, close-up look at what it takes to compete at the very highest level of the sport.

There's also something special for young fans: elementary school students who register in advance will receive expert coaching directly from the athletes, learning how to run faster, jump higher, and enjoy sport in a whole new way.

A photo spot with Tokyo Station as a dramatic backdrop and a pop-up shop selling official WCH Tokyo 25 merchandise will also be on site, making this a must-visit event for fans and families alike.

To mark the official countdown milestone on Thursday 5 June, Tokyo Skytree, one of the city's most iconic and recognisable landmarks, as well as Tokyo Metropolitan Government Building and bridges along the Sumida river, will be illuminated in the championships' signature colour of Edo purple, lighting up the skyline in a symbol of Tokyo's pride and anticipation for this year's spectacular event.

Join us and be part of this once-in-a-lifetime celebration as Japan prepares to welcome the world.

Taiho will also talk about what inspired him to take up the sport, his thoughts on the World Athletics Championships, and the athletes to watch this year.

High Jump Showcase with Japan Record Holder Naoto Tobe. Watch Naoto Tobe take to the air against the iconic backdrop of Tokyo Station. A seasoned competitor on the global stage including the Olympics and World Championships, Naoto now serves as Chair of the Japan Association of Athletics Federations' Athletes' Committee and as a board member of WCH Tokyo 25.

He'll demonstrate his powerful jumping technique and share easy-to-understand

tips on how to run and jump like a pro.







