MASCOT

Is a White Kotuda goose named "Goosia". The breed constitutes more than 90% of the Polish domestic goose population and is a source of food, pride, and local identity. It was developed at the Polish Research Institute of Animal Production in Kotuda Wielka near Inowrocław. For this reason, Kuyavia-Pomerania is often called Poland's goose heartland. In a public vote, the name "Goosia" beat Athletka, Balbinka, and Orbitka, which were shortlisted from a total of over 100 entries. "This name is a play on words. It's a reference to the English word "goose" and the Polish name Gosia. We hope that both Polish and foreign fans will have no problem pronouncing our mascot's name," say the organisers.

WORLD INDOOR CHAMPIONSHIPS FUN FACTS

The United States is far and away the most successful country with a total of 314 medals across all World Indoor Championships, World Indoor Games and exhibition events. That figure comprises 129 gold, 97 silver and 88 bronze medals. The 2026 hosts Poland have five golds, 15 silvers and 18 bronzes, including shares. The country with the most medals but no gold is Slovenia, with four silvers and four bronzes. The 1999 hosts Japan have the most bronzes, three, without a silver or gold. Scoring all placements in the top eight, Jamaica overtook France for fifth on the all-time points list in 2025, behind the USA, Russia, the Germanies, then Great Britain & NI.

A total of 218 different countries – past and present – have competed at the World Indoor Championships or Games. Of those, 125 have provided finalists, 92 have won medals and 63 have produced champions. Most recently the Commonwealth of Dominica, for whom Thea LaFond won the women's triple jump on the final day at Glasgow 2024.

The first World Indoor gold for Poland was won by Sebastian Chmara, who has been president of the Polish Athletics Association since November 2024. At Maebashi 1999, he triumphed in the Heptathlon ahead of Erki Nool (EST) and Roman Šebrle (CZE), who each went on to become Olympic Decathlon Champions.

The width of lanes on a short (200m) track can be between 0.90 and 1.22m, and therefore may be narrower than the 1.22m wide lanes required for an oval track outdoors. An important new rule in force for the 2026 season is that short track 800m runners will break from their lanes after the second bend (at 165m), rather than the first. The objective being to give athletes more time and space to spread out, providing a safer racing environment.

Exactly 101 world indoor championship gold medals have been awarded this decade, including the 29 given to individual winning relay team and squad members. Twenty-one were won by athletes from the USA, 13 by Belgians and eight by Ethiopians.

Two men have won individual golds at all three World Indoor Championships in the 2020s, pole vaulter Armand Duplantis of Sweden and 60m hurdler Grant Holloway of the USA. Each set world records in 2022, then at Nanjing 2025 both supplied extra special statistics. Duplantis cleared six metres for the 99th, 100th, 101st and 102nd time. Holloway won his 83rd, 84th & 85th successive indoor hurdles races since 2014, counting preliminaries.

Beside Duplantis and Holloway, a third athlete has taken three world indoor golds in the 2020s. That is 400m runner Alexander Doom of Belgium, with relay golds in 2022 & 2024 and the individual title in 2024. No woman has won three world golds across Belgrade, Glasgow and Nanjing, but Femke Bol (NED) has two golds and two silvers. Three further women have two individual golds and one silver: Ethiopian distance runners Freweyni Hailu & Gudaf Tsegay and Bahamian hurdler Devynne Charlton.

The one and only re-run at the championships came at Toronto 1993. In the women's 60m hurdles final, Jamaica's Michelle Freeman hit the final barrier while leading and veered into the path of Switzerland's Julie Baumann, who had been lying second. Baumann was obstructed and so the Jamaican was disqualified. The race was run again and Baumann emerged as the winner. Freeman's story indoors had a happy ending at Paris 1997 when she won the title herself.

Podium sweeps at the World Indoor Championships are rare, as there can only be more than two entrants from a single country unless a third has been awarded a wildcard place. There have been two instances, the 2022 women's 1500m for Ethiopia and the 2025 men's 400m for the United States.

The US 4x400m relay runner Calvin Smith Jr collected three world indoor golds in the 2010s. His namesake father was the 1983 and 1987 World Champion at 200m, outdoors. Smith the younger produced identical performances at Istanbul 2012 and Portland 2016. Both times he ran the second 4x400m leg for the USA, and both times he clocked a split of 45.69.

From November 1, 2023 'short track' world records were introduced for those bend track events and combined events traditionally staged indoors. Single, outright world records were recognised in straight track events, jumps and throws. Left are a set of historic performances which, though no longer official world records, stand as the best ever set in a facility with a roof. As at February 2026, these are: Men's High Jump – 2.43 Javier Sotomayor CUB 1989; Men's Pole Vault: 6.27 Armand Duplantis SWE 2025; Men's Long Jump: 8.79 Carl Lewis USA 1984; Men's Triple Jump: 18.07 Hugues Fabrice Zango BUR 2021; Men's Shot Put: 22.82 Ryan Crouser USA 2021; Women's High Jump: 2.08 Kajsa Bergqvist SWE 2006; Women's Pole Vault: 5.03 Jenn Suhr USA 2016; Women's Long Jump: 7.37 Heike Drechsler GDR 1988; Women's Shot Put: 22.50 Helena Fibingerová TCH 1977. The one technical event with an outright world record set indoors is the women's triple jump. Yulimar Rojas VEN cleared 15.74 at the 2022 World Indoor Championships in Belgrade.

Poland's one and only female World Indoor Champion made history with her victory at Sopot 2014. Kamila Lićwinko (née Stepaniuk), along with Russia's Mariya Kuchina (later Lasitskene) agreed to share the high jump gold, the first-ever such decision at any World Championships. The two women had identical cards up to 2.00, then elected not to contest a jump-off after both failed at 2.02.

The most bemedalled Polish athletes at the World Indoor Championships have been Adam Kszczot and Justyna Święty-Ersetic. Adam won a complete set of medals in the 800m, including gold in 2018. Justyna has collected four relay medals, three silvers and a bronze. As well as contesting four individual 400m finals.

Poland's most recent world indoor title was won in style at Birmingham 2018, when the men's 4x400m relay team of Karol Zalewski, Rafał Omelko, Łukasz Krawczuk and Jakub Krzewina came from behind to defeat a high class US quartet. In doing so, they lowered the official world record to 3:01.77. Patryk Adamczyk, who deputised for Omelko in the heats, was also awarded a gold medal. An earlier generation of Polish 400m runners won the same title at Lisbon 2001: Piotr Rysiukiewicz, Piotr Haczek, Jacek Bocian and Robert Maćkowiak.

Toruń is not the only city in the province of Kuyavia-Pomerania (Kujawy Pomorze in Polish) to have staged a World Championships. Bydgoszcz has twice hosted the World Cross Country Championships at Myslecinek Park, in 2010 and 2013. Also in that city 50 years ago, the great Irena Szewińska set the second of her three world records at 400m, 49.75 in 1976. That feat was commemorated with a World Athletics Heritage plaque at the Zawiszy Zdzisława stadium in 2020.
